



**Specialized Dictionaries and Encyclopedias:** Many encyclopedias and dictionaries are subject-specific and might be several volumes. In most cases, the entries are articles that have been written by individual authors. You must give list the editor(s) & full publishing info in these cases:

**Citing Magazine & Journal Articles:** Are your articles in print or electronic? Do they have a DOI number? Find the citation differences below.

\*NOTE\*: Electronic articles from many article databases have DOI numbers. This can be found on the article entry in the database or the article itself. If one is available, cite this way.

**Electronic Article with DOI#:**

**Citing Internet Sources**

List as much of the following information as possible (you sometimes have to hunt around to find the information).

**Non-periodical web document, web page, or report:**
